Political Contributions & Related Activity Report Overview

At UnitedHealth Group, our 380,000 colleagues are driven to advance our mission: To help people live healthier lives and help make the health system work better for everyone.

In support of advancing our mission, we engage in efforts to inform public policy decisions to ensure all people have access to high-quality, affordable health care and an improved, simplified experience for patients and providers. Our efforts include developing public policy solutions, educational outreach, trade association memberships, lobbying, and making bipartisan political contributions – including through the Company's political action committee, the UnitedHealth Group PAC.

In this Report, we provide transparency into the Company's participation in these activities including disclosure of political contributions and trade association memberships to which the Company paid dues of \$50,000 or greater in 2022. Our participation is designed to improve the health care system and positively impact the people we are privileged to serve, our employees, and shareholders. UnitedHealth Group's core public policy priorities — expanding access to care, improving health care affordability, and enhancing the health care experience — form the foundational basis that guides and informs the Company's decisions regarding political contributions and public policy engagement.

Strong and effective governance practices are essential to UnitedHealth Group's engagement in the policymaking process. The Governance Committee of the Board of Directors provides oversight of political contributions and public policy activities. The Board of Directors has adopted a Political Contributions Policy that summarizes the policies and procedures we follow with respect to political contributions. We also have a robust internal review process in place to evaluate every political contribution. All of these activities are in compliance with applicable federal and state laws. In addition to regular disclosure to the appropriate federal and state agencies, and in accordance with our Political Contributions Policy, we publish semi-annual disclosures of political contributions on our website.

Our bipartisan political giving comes with the understanding that we may not agree with every position taken by each recipient of political contributions from the Company on the many issues considered by policymakers and candidates for public office. This Report provides retrospective information for the applicable period. Past support of a candidate or an organization cannot be assumed to mean that the Company and/or its PACs are providing similar support today.

Our Approach, Policies and Procedures

Public polices impacting the people and communities we serve are always being considered in Washington, D.C. and in all 50 states. We believe it is our responsibility – on behalf of our customers, employees, Company, and shareholders – to engage in the public policy arena on a bipartisan basis. Our engagement, which includes making bipartisan political contributions, is focused on advancing solutions that expand access to care, improve health care affordability, and enhance the health care experience.

Board Oversight

The Governance Committee of the Board of Directors has oversight of political contributions and public policy activities. The Governance Committee's responsibilities include:

- Reviewing and recommending to the Board any changes to the Company's Political Contributions Policy periodically.
- Reviewing at least semi-annually political contributions made by the Company and its political action committees and approving the public disclosure of such contributions.
- Monitoring the Company's advocacy and lobbying processes and activities, including key trade association and coalition memberships.
- Overseeing the manner in which the Company conducts its public policy and government relations activities.
- Overseeing the Company's external relations functions and activities.

The Governance Committee receives regular reports from Company leadership on these matters, oversees our policies, and reviews the purposes of these activities at each meeting. Our activities include developing public policy solutions, educational outreach, trade association memberships, lobbying, and making bipartisan political contributions. These activities are included in the total annual fiscal budget, which is subject to the approval and oversight of our Board of Directors. UnitedHealth Group made no independent expenditures in 2022.

Public Policy Priorities

UnitedHealth Group's approach to political contributions and advocacy broadly is grounded in our public policy priorities.

We are committed to a future where every person has access to high-quality, affordable health care and a modern, high-performing health system that reduces disparities, improves outcomes and lessens the burden of disease. We publicly describe our core public policy priorities — **expanding access to care**, **improving health care affordability**, and **enhancing the health care experience** — and outline actionable and timely solutions to achieve these priorities in UnitedHealth Group's <u>A Path Forward</u>. We also detail additional actions and commitments to help build a modern, high-performing health system and achieve our mission in our <u>Sustainability Report</u>.

Our Approach, Policies and Procedures

Lobbying Activities

Our lobbying activities are based on our public policy priorities outlined in A Path Forward.

Lobbying activity is highly regulated. UnitedHealth Group maintains strict compliance with applicable federal and state laws, including the Lobbying Disclosure Act and Honest Leadership and Open Government Act. We file lobbying disclosure reports quarterly with the U.S. Congress, which are available here, and state lobbying disclosure reports with the appropriate state governing agencies. The Governance Committee oversees the Company's lobbying processes and activities.

Political Contributions

In support of advancing our mission, we engage in efforts to inform public policy decisions, including making bipartisan political contributions.

The **UnitedHealth Group PAC** is funded entirely by voluntary, personal contributions from eligible employees and individuals. The PAC makes contributions to federal and state candidates and political committees on a bipartisan basis. All PAC contributions are disclosed regularly to the Federal Election Commission (FEC) and appropriate state agencies.

Federal election law prohibits using corporate treasury funds to contribute to federal candidates and political parties. We make corporate contributions in some states, where permissible and in accordance with state election laws.

In addition to filing regular disclosure reports with the FEC and applicable state agencies, we also disclose political contributions via semi-annual reports on our website, in accordance with our Political Contributions Policy.

Political contributions are made on a bipartisan basis and several factors are considered when contributing including a candidate's role in advancing health care policy priorities that impact the people we serve and our Company.

The Board of Directors has adopted a Political Contributions Policy that summarizes the policies and procedures we follow with respect to political contributions, which it reviews periodically. We also have a robust internal review process in place to evaluate every political contribution, which includes review by our External Affairs department and legal counsel.

Trade Association Membership

We are committed to engaging trade association partners as we work to advance our mission and public policy priorities. Our participation in select industry and trade associations comes with the understanding that we might not always agree with all positions held by the organizations, and that we are committed to communicating and aligning on our priority public policy positions.

Trade associations may allocate a portion of dues received for certain non-deductible lobbying and political expenditures under Section 162(e)(1)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code. In this Report, we have listed trade associations that received dues from the Company totaling \$50,000 or more in a given year and the portion of dues attributed to non-deductible lobbying and political expenditures.
