27% (370,383) of Medicare beneficiaries in Massachusetts were enrolled in Medicare Advantage (MA) in 2020.


The average Medicare Advantage and Prescription Drug (MA-PD) plan beneficiary in Massachusetts spends:



\$1,295 Less than a beneficiary in Massachusetts who enrolls in traditional Medicare Fee-For-Service (FFS) and a prescription drug plan (PDP)

\$2,113 Less than a beneficiary in Massachusetts who also purchases **Medigap Plan G as supplemental coverage for medical out-of-pocket costs**

In addition to the dental, vision, and hearing benefits typically offered, **the average MA-PD beneficiary in Massachusetts receives \$136 in annual supplemental benefits**, such as care coordination, meals and non-emergency transportation, not offered by Medicare FFS.
