

Nevada Medicare Advantage Beneficiaries Receive Better Value and Spend 51% Less than Beneficiaries in Medicare FFS

41% (223,146) of Medicare beneficiaries in Nevada were enrolled in Medicare Advantage (MA) in 2020.

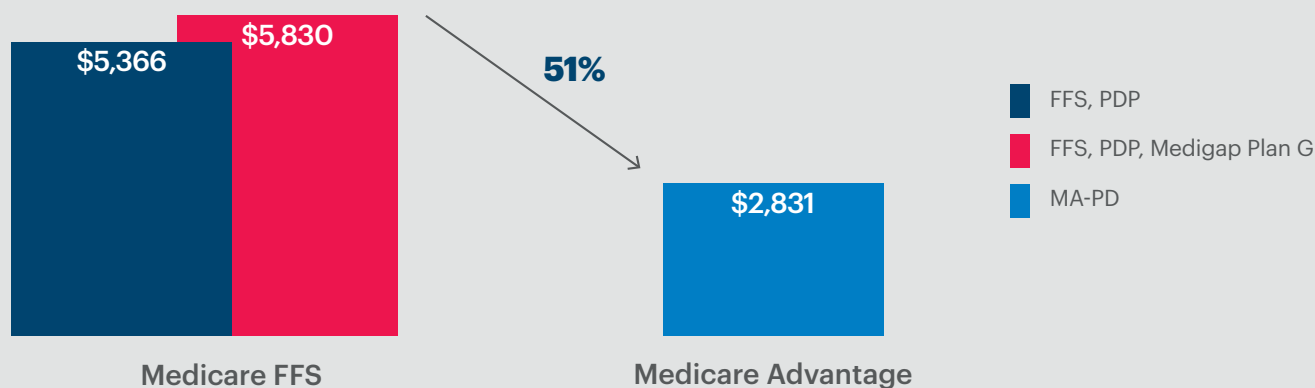
The average Medicare Advantage and Prescription Drug (MA-PD) plan beneficiary in Nevada spends:



\$2,535 Less than a beneficiary in Nevada who enrolls in traditional **Medicare Fee-For-Service (FFS) and a prescription drug plan (PDP)**

\$2,999 Less than a beneficiary in Nevada who also purchases **Medigap Plan G as supplemental coverage for medical out-of-pocket costs**

Within All Age Groups, Nevada's Beneficiaries in MA-PD Spend Less than those in Medicare FFS

\$2,135 to \$2,703 Less
than a **65-year old** FFS
beneficiary in average health



\$3,023 to \$3,452 Less
than an **85-year old** FFS
beneficiary in average health

In addition to the dental, vision, and hearing benefits typically offered, **the average MA-PD beneficiary in Nevada receives \$197 in annual supplemental benefits**, such as care coordination, meals and non-emergency transportation, not offered by Medicare FFS.
