

# Wisconsin Medicare Advantage Beneficiaries Receive Better Value and Spend 40% Less than Beneficiaries in Medicare FFS

**47% (563,364) of Medicare beneficiaries in Wisconsin were enrolled in Medicare Advantage (MA) in 2020.**

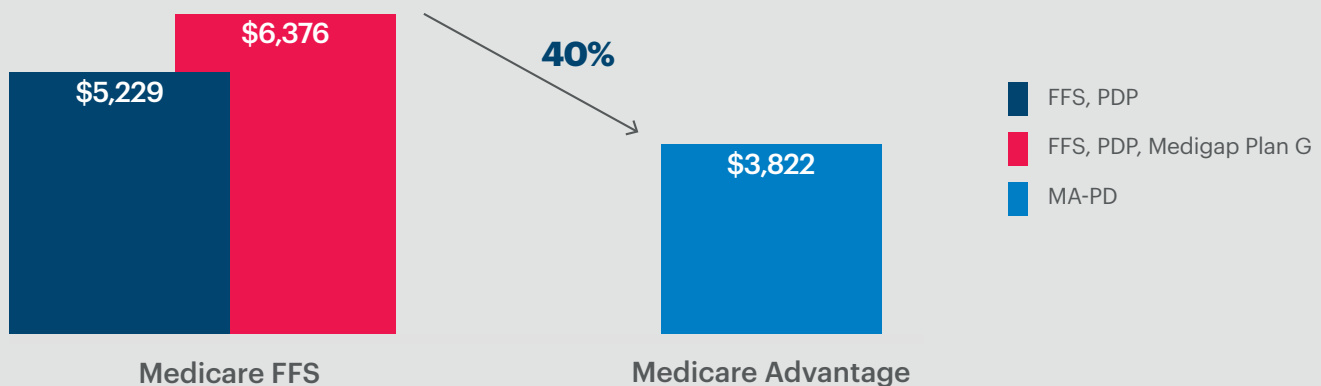
The average Medicare Advantage and Prescription Drug (MA-PD) plan beneficiary in Wisconsin spends:



**\$1,407 Less** than a beneficiary in Wisconsin who enrolls in traditional **Medicare Fee-For-Service (FFS) and a prescription drug plan (PDP)**

**\$2,554 Less** than a beneficiary in Wisconsin who also purchases **Medigap Plan G as supplemental coverage for medical out-of-pocket costs**

## Within All Age Groups, Wisconsin's Beneficiaries in MA-PD Spend Less than those in Medicare FFS

**\$1,219 to \$2,236 Less**  
than a **65-year old** FFS  
beneficiary in average health



**\$1,617 to \$3,179 Less**  
than an **85-year old** FFS  
beneficiary in average health

In addition to the dental, vision, and hearing benefits typically offered, **the average MA-PD beneficiary in Wisconsin receives \$131 in annual supplemental benefits**, such as care coordination, meals and non-emergency transportation, not offered by Medicare FFS.
